RE: Language Accessible Voter Registration and Vote By Mail

Dear Secretary Schmidt,

We are grateful for the Pennsylvania Department of State's collaborative approach with community stakeholder organizations and election officials toward ensuring language access to the ballot. The Department's Language Access Guidance to counties was a significant step toward equity in voting. We continue to share a priority of ensuring that all eligible Pennsylvanians can cast a ballot no matter their ethnic or national origins so that every voter can exercise their fundamental right to vote.

Voters who speak primary languages other than English have historically been victims of de facto disenfranchisement where ballots and other critical election materials are provided only in English. Throughout Pennsylvania, at least 380,000 people speak primary languages other than English. According to the Pennsylvania Immigrant and Citizenship Coalition, New Americans represented at least 7.9% of the voting population in PA in 2020, and this number has since grown.

Therefore, we strongly encourage the Pennsylvania Department of State to make the low-cost, high-impact investments to publish (1) **voter registration** and (2) **vote-by-mail** forms in *at least ten of the Commonwealth's most-spoken languages* beyond what is mandated by Sec. 203 of the Voting Rights Act. The form designs should include both English and the minority language for versatility of use and ease of processing by election officials.

Analysis of the most recent U.S. Census data shows that between **98,290 and 251,701** eligible Pennsylvania voters could be better served with expanded form availability for LEP (Limited English Proficiency) citizens of voting age in the following most spoken languages: Vietnamese, Pennsylvania German, Russian, Nepali, Korean, Arabic, Bengali, Italian, Gujarati, French, and Khemr (Cambodian). The cited population data of this breakdown is included as an exhibit with this letter.

In 2020, the Department proactively published Chinese and Vietnamese language voter registration and vote-by-mail forms beyond federal legal requirements, however, the Vietnamese language voting forms are no longer available on the Department website.

Voter registration is the first step of political participation, foundational to the relationship between the state and its citizenry. It is also noteworthy that mail voting eliminates sometimes intimidating or hostile environments that new Americans face at polling places. We, therefore, urge your department to make this meaningful step toward voter enfranchisement for minority language-speaking communities on the margins, and with less than 70 days

until Election Day, there is a closing window for the administration to uphold its values of equity and inclusivity for language minority voters ahead of this important election year.

We look forward to further collaborating with your office to review any content that might be necessary to ensure publication in time for the November general election. Members of our coalition will be glad to discuss the next steps in addressing the vital need for voter registration and vote-by-mail forms with Department staff.
