

# Voting Resources *for* Floridians



## Vote-by-Mail

If you would like to have a vote-by-mail ballot mailed to you for elections taking place between January 1, 2025, and December 31, 2026, you must submit a vote-by-mail request. This applies to all voters, even if you voted by mail in the 2024 General Election. The deadline to apply is 5 p.m. on the 12th day before election day. ### 3Pvro Deadlines & Fines Cheat-Sheet

Deadline to deliver collected voter registration applications:	10 days, or before book closing if less than 10 days.
Applications delivered after 10 days of being collected:	\$50* per each day late.
Applications collected before book closing but delivered after the deadline:	\$100* per each day late.
Applications not delivered to the county in which the applicant resides:	\$500* per each day late.
If a 3Pvro is convicted of altering an application without the knowledge or consent of an applicant:	\$5,000
Annual fines cap:	\$250,000

*\*Fines may be higher if it's determined the 3Pvro acted willfully.*
